Our Aims and Objectives

At **Raudhatul Uloom**, we teach children the core principles of Islam, including the **Qur'an**, **Aqeedah** (Islamic beliefs), **Fiqh** (philosophy of Islamic law), **Hadith** (sayings and actions of the Prophet Muhammad), **prayer** (Salah), **Islamic history**, **Qur'an memorisation**, and moral values to build a strong foundation in their faith. We also focus on cultivating qualities such as honesty, kindness, respect, patience, and empathy, aiming to teach children good behaviour, self-discipline, and accountability, encouraging them to live by Islamic values both in their personal lives and within the community. Furthermore, we help children learn the Arabic language for Qur'anic recitation, ensuring they pray with the correct Tajweed (rules for pronunciation) and accurate recitation, and offer basic education in other subjects to ensure well-rounded intellectual and spiritual development

Dresscode of our Madrasah

Although Madrasah Raudhatul Uloom does not have a specific uniform, parents are asked to ensure their children follow the dress code, which includes the following:

For Boys:

- **Shorts:** Shorts should be no shorter than knee length.
- **Clothing Design:** Avoid clothing with images of cartoons, animals, or other live objects.
- **Jubba:** Boys must wear a Jubba (long garment) to madrasah
- **Headwear:** An Islamic hat, such as a taqiyah or kufi, must be worn to madrassa.

For Girls:

- **Headscarf:** Girls must wear a scarf or hijab to cover their hair.
- **Modest Clothing:** Long dresses or loose clothing should be worn.
- **Abaya:** If wearing an abaya, appropriate clothing must be worn underneath.
- **Clothing Design:** Avoid clothing with images of cartoons, animals, or other live objects.
- **Makeup:** Girls should not wear makeup to madrasah..

Children who do not adhere to the dress code policy may be sent home.

Behaviour and Academic Performance

In the event that a student does not meet the expected standards of behavior or academic performance, a structured system of progressive sanctions will be implemented. This approach is designed to encourage improvement and support the student in achieving their full potential.

Mobile Phones

Students at Madrasah Raudhatul Uloom may bring mobile phones only when absolutely necessary and with prior permission. The following guidelines must be followed:

- Students must obtain permission **before** bringing a mobile phone to the Madrasah.
- Upon arrival, mobile phones **must be handed over to the teacher** and can be collected at the end of the day.
- If a student is found using or having a mobile phone on the premises without permission, the phone will be confiscated and parents will be required to come in to retrieve the confiscated phone.
- Mobile phones are **not** to be used at any time while on the Madrasah premises.

By following these guidelines, we can ensure a focused and distraction-free learning environment for all students.

Time Keeping and Attendance

Drop-off and Pick-up

- **Nursery Class: 5:30 PM - 6:30 PM**
- **Remaining Classes: 5:30 PM - 7:15 PM**

Timely drop-offs and pick-ups help us maintain a smooth schedule and ensure the safety and well-being of all children. If someone else is collecting your child you must let madrasah know in advance so we are aware of this, otherwise students will not be released.

Attendance:

Please inform the Madrasah administration before the 5:30pm if your child will be absent on that day.

Holiday Request

Parents need to seek permission prior to booking any Holidays via madrasah holiday form. Once permission granted only then Holidays can be booked.

If you have any concerns regarding your child, please do not hesitate to speak to **Molana Sufyaan (Headteacher)** or **Appa Ammarah (Head Appa/admin)**. They will be more than happy to assist you. Your Safeguarding leads are **Molana Talhah** for the boys side and **Appa Ammarah** for the girls side. Should they not be available then **Molana Sufyaan** and **Appa muimmah** will be available as deputy.
